

David Skulski

Well known to the musical world in Vancouver, Mr. Skulski was appointed solo English Horn with the Vancouver Symphony at the age of 17. After leaving the VSO he played with the CBC Radio orchestra and the Orquesta Sinfónica de Xalapa (Mexico). On returning to Canada, because of his interest in historical music, he founded Early Music Vancouver. Subsequently he was Resident-in-Music at SFU, taught renaissance music in Austria, founded and directed The Towne Waytes (renaissance band) and Harmonie (18th C. Wind ensemble).

He has long had an interest in Jewish culture and is presently the General Manager of the Peretz Centre for Jewish Culture and has been associated with the Centre since the age of 5. As a teacher, he is on the faculty of the Dena Wosk School of Music and has lectured on musical subjects at Simon Fraser University and UBC.

He is also a voice actor and has recorded several audio books and documentaries and frequently narrates and hosts the concerts of the Vancouver Chamber Music Society.
